FROM THE PASTOR

"What is God doing in this passage?" and "What is the message for the church?" Those were the two questions that Dr. Georjean Banton, the mentor for my internship at New World United

Methodist Church in Garland, Texas, asked at the end of Bible study on Tuesday morning. Georjean came up with the Bible study as a way of getting the congregation's input on the scripture for the upcoming Sunday.

It was a fun class. We met at the church, and we had a good turnout and a lot of meaningful discussions. I preached once a month during my internship, and got to teach the class the week before I spoke and on a few other occasions, too. The class has served as a template for Bible studies and conversations I've led since, including the one that we began offering last month at the Daily Dose. We're three weeks into that study, and we've had four or five people on hand each week, and there's room for more. We meet at 10:30am, and I make a point of letting everyone know in advance what our text will be for the following week.

We had morning and evening sessions of these conversations in King George. The morning session met Tuesdays at a place called Uncle Dave's, and evening studies on Wednesdays rotated among sites like Roma Pizza, Pancho Villa, and Vinny's. The evening sessions continued via phone or Google Meets when COVID struck, and having a phone line was a good backup since broadband internet was scarce in the county.

Please let me know if anyone's interested in having an evening study session. It's good for us to get together in public, and customers at the Daily Dose have taken notice of us, so an additional meeting at a different place and time might help us reach more people with the word of God and love of Christ. Again, please let me know if an evening study interests you.





Easter Prayer Vigil – The New Normal?

The New Testament contains many letters to the early churches about their challenges and rewards. We too are facing challenges and may lose sight of our reward. Like those early churches, we are in a time of great upheaval. The ongoing COVID pandemic along with racial, political and financial unrest have turned our world upside down, not to mention threats of war and violence. Our church services have changed – from virtual on-line worship services to supper with our Lord in those tiny, uncooperative communion cups! How can

High Street church continue in mission to God's world in all this turmoil?

One way we serve God is through prayer. On the Saturday before Easter, representing the time that Jesus' human body lay in the tomb, we strive for continual prayer. We pray for our world, our community, our church, and our family. We pray to thank God for sending His Son to save us. We pray to become the people God wants us to be. We pray in thanksgiving and in hope.

We have struggled with how to continue the ministry of the Easter Prayer Vigil with these changing times. In the past, we have asked for church members to come to the church building to pray for an hour. Setting aside a quiet hour to pray is a beautiful thing. But you don't have to be in a beautiful building to talk to God. He is everywhere we are, whether it is at church, at home, in the park, or even driving down the road.

So we are asking you to pledge an hour to pray. If you want to come to the church building, there will be devotional materials and communion available in the Birdsong parlor. We will start at 8:00am and plan to pray throughout the day. Susan will ring the church bells at midnight to announce the arrival of Easter, and anyone is welcome to join in the celebration. Let either Susan or Cara know when you plan to come so we can let you into the building. If you would rather pray at home or wherever you may be, that works too. There will be a signup board in the Narthex for you to pledge your time, or if you are worshipping with us virtually, call or email us to sign up.

Mission Team Report

Our High Street UMC family continues to be very mission-oriented. During the month of March we focused on our "penny project". This is our collection of pennies and other coins that will continue until the end of the summer and will go to the Heifer Project International. We will be able to choose which animals we want to be given to families to help better their lives. Heifer International chooses families all around the world and teaches

them how to use certain animals to give them more food and an income to be able to live a more fulfilled life. These families in turn share the gift by passing on an offspring of their animal to another family nearby. On March 20—14 children gathered together in the fellowship and courtyard of our

church and enjoyed lunch, games, a craft, making a bank for their pennies, and 4 very special visitors... 2 baby goats and 2 rabbits!! It was loads of fun, and the children will be collecting their pennies and bringing them back to church to help. You can bring coins by the church office or place them in the brass container on the round table in the narthex on Sunday mornings.





The "bathroom project" at the mission house on Walnut Street has been completed! What a great job the team did with complete redoing the only bathroom in that house! Thanks to all who led and helped with this project! We'll give them a little break and will let you know what's next!

The Mission Team voted to give a \$200 donation to Heart Havens, the non-profit organization that provides homes for adults with developmental disabilities in 6 different locations throughout the state of Virginia. We also delivered the items collected during the month of February to their office in Richmond. (3-ply masks, hand sanitizer, and antibacterial wipes and spray) Thanks for your generous donations.

The Mission Team also voted to send a \$150 donation to Freekind Virginia to be used for their upcoming 5K on April 30. This 5K is a fundraiser to help prevent human trafficking in our Tidewater area, including Franklin and Southampton County.

Our April Mission of the Month Project will focus on the Genieve Shelter. Their mission is "to provide a safe refuge and supportive environment for the victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking and human trafficking, and to provide information, education, and training services which focus on ending the cycles of violence."
