I like to involve others in worship as I feel it a way of fostering discipleship and spiritual growth, and one of my favorite things to do is put together a service for others to lead.

I first sensed this while serving the Cheriton charge 2000-4. One week, my allergies were so bad that I was sure that I would end up with laryngitis. While I could still talk, I asked folks from my two

churches to be ready read my sermon, just in case. Nancy Ulrich read the message at Travis Chapel and Bonnie Lewis did so at Cheriton, and I sat back and enjoyed being in worship.

This proved true again in Japan when my commanding officer at Camp Fuji asked me to organize a Dr. Martin Luther King Day observance in 2005. I put the service together using resources I found on the internet and gave all the speaking parts to Marines and sailors, except for the CO's comments, which were extemporaneous. I found it both meaningful and gratifying to be behind the scenes as the service played out.

This was also my plan for an Easter sunrise service in Iraq in 2008. The command chaplain preached, and I assigned the eight other chaplains there the scriptures and prayers that were part of the service, and again prepared to sit back and enjoy worship. That would have been a really good plan since I ended up having a wisdom tooth pulled the day before and nearly passed out Easter morning when I tried to shave, but another chaplain had to go home on emergency leave and I took his part, a long reading from the Psalms. I just made sure that I sat near the edge of the stage to get as much air as possible, and I took a nap before preaching at another service that afternoon.

I say all of this as a way of inviting you to take part in our Blue Christmas service on December 16th at 7 p.m. It's a service of readings, carols, candle lighting, and prayers, and I made sure that I read no more than one part when we had the service two years ago in King George and again last year at Djibouti. We've got one volunteer so far – Michele Virtue, who will both read and sing – for this year and I invite others. This is a service for those who may find the holidays difficult to celebrate. There are readings from John, Ecclesiastes, the Psalms, and Isaiah, and carols and hymns that last year included "Silent Night," "Away in a Manger," "O Little Town of Bethlehem," and "Guide Me, O Thou Great Jehovah." The service was well-received in both King George and Djibouti, and I hope that it will be here as well. We had five readers at King George and nine, I think, in Djibouti.

Please consider attending the service, inviting others, and volunteering to take part. It was wonderful having folks the community attend in King George, and I hope that we'll have folks outside of High Street join us that evening.



This is a busy time of the year but also one filled with many blessings. My church family is a true blessing to me. You all have been so generous in your giving these past few months. I just want to say "thank you" for your contributions of your time, your talents and your gifts to our many mission projects.

For the first time in our 9 years of supporting the Backpack Program, this mission project is fully funded for the whole year. It usually takes us until May or June to accomplish this goal! Also thank you to the many volunteers who have helped receive, put away, pack and deliver the food for our food insufficient children at our local elementary school. Our next packing session is on **December 14th at 5:00 p.m.** in the fellowship hall. Hope to see you there.



A heartfelt thanks also to all of you who donated food and money for our Thanksgiving project. Because of your gifts we were able to pack 35 Thanksgiving bags of food and include a \$25 Food Lion gift card in each one. We delivered these to the Franklin Cooperative Ministries where they were distributed to needy families and individuals in our community.

After several trips to the Southampton County Social Services Department in Courtland, we ended up delivering about 70 skeins of yarn for the prisoners at the Deerfield correctional facility in Capron. Some of the inmates there will be crocheting and knitting hats, scarves and other items of warmth for local residents who need them this winter. Thank you all for these donations!! This is a double blessing because we are giving the inmates a chance to help others as well as give them something to do with their time, and we are helping some of the less fortunate residents of Southampton County.

Our Mission of the month for December is the opportunity to give to any or all of our three Advent trees - the Tree of Stars, the Angel Tree, and the Tree of Warmth. See the article on the next page for more details about these trees and our January Mission of the Month.

Our <u>ANGEL TREE</u> is back and this year you will be able to pick an angel or two off of the tree to provide a gift for a child in Southampton County to help make their Christmas a little brighter. These children are selected by the Southampton County Department of Social Services. Each tag will have the first name of a child along with a couple of gift ideas and the age of the child. We are suggesting that you keep the gift in the range of \$25-\$40, and we are asking that you not take more than 3 angels, so that



others may have a chance at getting an angel. The angel tags will be up on the tree as soon as they become available, hopefully sometime during the week of December 1st, but definitely by Sunday, December 5th. Please sign your name next to the tree with the ID number of the child. The wrapped presents with the angel tag attached are due back under the tree no later than Tuesday, December 14th. Thank you so much for making a child's Christmas special!

# TREE OF WARMTH

Each year during the month of December, the HSUMC Mission Team provides a chance for you all to help provide items of warmth for children and adults in our community who might not have the resources to buy gloves, mittens, hats, scarves, socks, coats, and even pjs. We would prefer new items but will accept very gently used and CLEAN items as well. This tree will be up in the Open Door Cafe during December. Just hang your items on the tree or put them in the box or under the tree. Please have these donations in by **Sunday, January 2nd.** 

These will be sorted and delivered to S.P. Morton Elementary School, Riverdale Elementary School and the Franklin Cooperative Ministries.

Our third Mission Tree is the <u>TREE OF STARS</u>. This tree is in the narthex and has been a tradition for many years at HSUMC. The purpose of this tree is for people to be able to place a star on the tree in memory of or in honor of a loved one, friend, someone who has done something special, or for any reason. There are forms to fill out in this newsletter or at the church. Each star costs \$7. This special tree raises money for the missionary that HSUMC sponsors. His name is Jacques



Akasa Umembudi, and he is the pilot for the Wings of Caring Aviation Ministry in the Democratic Republic of the Congo in Africa. He is a missionary of the United Methodist Board of Global Ministries and has visited our church 2 or 3 times over the years. Each year we send \$2500 to support him and his program. Donations for the Tree of Stars will be accepted through December, but if you want the names included in the booklet that is printed, please have your donations and forms in by **Monday, December 13th.** 



Our January Mission of the Month project will be our new penny project, **Heifer International**, an organization that provides animals to poor families in many places around the world. These animals can provide food, clothing, income, and other opportunities to help pull families out of poverty and give them a chance at a better life. There are collection items

such as brass pots and banks in the narthex or you may drop your pennies and other coins off in the church office. We will be providing some activities for the children to become involved with this project beginning in January. Stay tuned for more information.

# Merry Christmas and Happy New Year from the UMW!


- <u>Night Time Circle</u>, watch your email for details of our supper meeting in December. The January meeting will be held in the Fellowship hall on the 24th.









