It's almost time for Lent, and remember the rules for giving up something for Lent: Don't tell anyone what you give up because it, like a fast, is a secret between you and God. Also, whatever you give up, you may still have on Sundays. That means that if Ann Britt gives up watching UNC basketball for Lent and Ann Jervey does the same with Duke, they can both watch games on Sunday, but they can't tell anyone that that's what they've planned.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, Feb. 22, when we'll have a service at 7 p.m. That's also the date that Lenten luncheon resume at Hunterdale Christian Church. Rev. Jean Vinson of Emmanuel Episcopal Church confirmed that the luncheons are on and that High Street is participating, but she has not asked us to sign up for a date yet. I'll keep you posted. Since I'm also volunteering for the Foodbank, 1-4 p.m., April 22, I'm a bit concerned about that date, but, from what people have told me of past luncheons, I should be able to do both. I'm helping sort food at 618 South Street that day and will help again with the Foodbank marketplace, Saturday, Feb. 25, 1-4 p.m., at 618. Please let me know if you're interested in Foodbank events, or please see Hope Hickam as she's a Food Bank volunteer.

As I said in worship Jan. 15, I'm thinking of offering a Wesley Covenant Service on the first Sunday in Lent, which is Feb. 26. I was prompted to do this while writing my sermon for Jan. 15 on John 1:29-42, when I said that Jesus' first words in John are "What do you want?" I said that we may need to wait a few weeks to answer that question and to work with Gospel passages from the Sermon on the Mount in the meantime. Please let me know if you are interested in a Wesleyan Covenant Service. I can share the liturgy with you from the United Methodist Book of Worship.

Speaking of sharing, I've been wondering when to offer videos from Liz Curtis Higgs, such as her *Unveiling Mary Magdalene* study and *Bad Girls of the Bible* series. I've decided that Soup for Supper gives us a chance to watch these together, and I'd like to start with the Mary Magdalene video, Thursday, Feb. 2, after Soup for Supper. We may go to the Dave Trader room to use the DVD player there. Please let me know if you're interested and if we may need to plan child care for that evening. All the videos are about an hour long, and maybe we can watch another Thursday, March 2, at the same time.

I was thrilled to learn that the Mission Team gave the GLA staff Christmas gifts. I've asked in this space for ministry to our Boy and Girl Scout troops and day school, and now I'm asking for help in another arena: our youth. I've been offering a youth Sunday school class since November, using curriculum found at the UMC Discipleship Ministries website. I've had as many as three students and as few as one, and we've had members of the church sit down with us on occasion to share experiences and insights. Harlan and Margaret Lewis were able to speak to the class of their time in Mexico on the Day of the Dead holiday, and Louise Blythe shared a story about swimming when we discussed the Baptism of the Lord. I'd like to get volunteers to help on a regular basis. To me, having more than one adult present speaks to the church's investment in its youth, so please consider joining Riley, Hayden, Julia, Tristan, and me and let me know which Sundays you can volunteer. I can send you lesson plans in advance and appreciate your praying with me as we prepare.

Finally, let me thank everyone who helped with decorating and un-decorating the church for Advent and Christmas, and everyone who helped with the celebrations of the lives of Gilbert Porter and Glenn Rawlings, and please let me put in an early bid for Vacation Bible School. We'll need a leader, we'll need to pick a curriculum and dates, so please pray about the choices that we'll make and the leadership of this ministry.

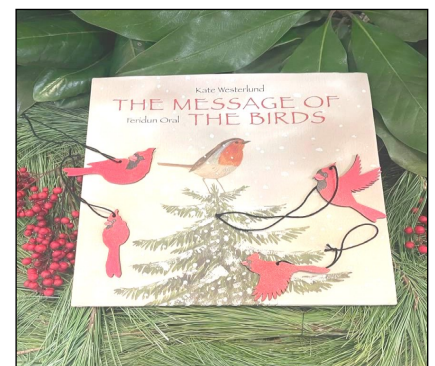

You all provided gifts for 37 children in Franklin and Southampton County through our Angel Tree.

You also donated 157 items of warm clothing throughout Tree of Warmth. These hats, gloves, scarves, jackets, coats socks, and other items were sorted and donated to S.P. Morton Elementary School and the Franklin Cooperative Ministries to be passed out to those children and adults in need this winter.

CHAIR YOGA



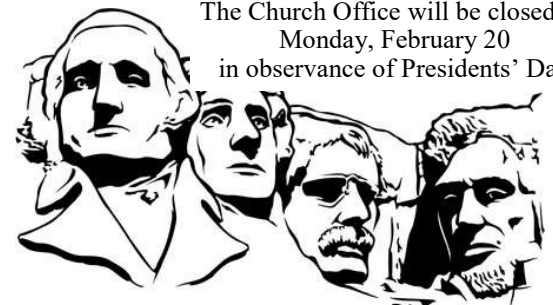

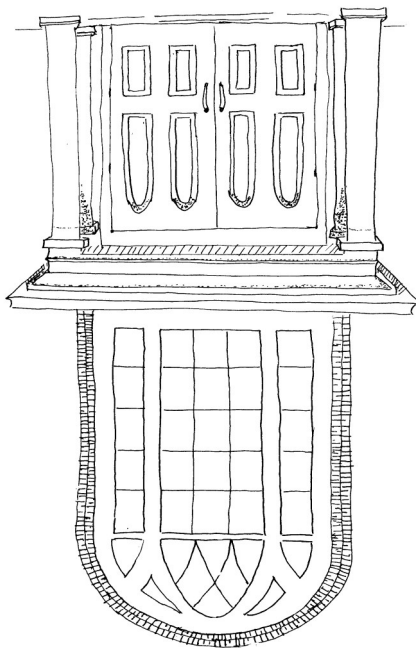
