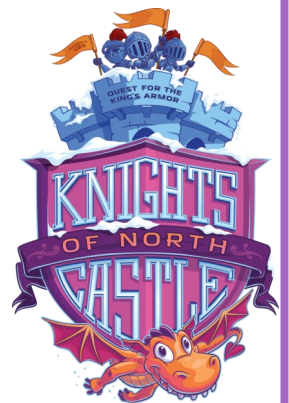

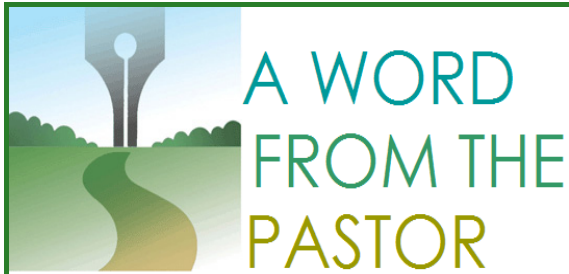

I may have left Annual Conference in Hampton with more of a sense of peace than others, because my recollection is based on the worship and Bible studies that we had, rather than the controversies that arose. The most tense time was Friday morning, when the report of the minutes committee was held up by a protest on declaratory decisions. I'll only comment to say that I thought that Bishop Lewis handled the protest properly and admirably. Her leadership throughout the conference was outstanding, including the altar call that she had at the end of Thursday's opening worship service after she'd preached a powerful sermon.

After the opening worship service, the Rev. Denise Bates, dean of the conference Cabinet, gave the report of the Cabinet, including the news that eight churches on the conference were closing effective June 30 and that three other churches – Etlan UMC, Charlottesville District; Drummondtown on the Eastern Shore District; and Lebanon UMC, Farmville District – had voted to disaffiliate or exit the conference. Reasons for these three churches' disaffiliation were not given, although none exited per the guidelines of paragraph 2553 of *The Book of Discipline*, which governs the process for local churches seeking to disaffiliate over matters of human sexuality.

The Thursday session was supposed to end with a vote on district realignment, but the vote was tabled until Friday morning and was then passed. That puts High Street in the Living Waters District, which combines the former Farmville and James River districts.

There will be a called Annual Conference Oct. 29 to ratify the disaffiliation of local churches seeking to disaffiliate under the guidelines of paragraph 2553. The conference will be held virtually, and any churches that have decided to disaffiliate and wish to be considered at that conference must complete approvals and agreements by Sept. 30.

In an earlier newsletter column, I offered to teach the study *Living Faithfully: Human Sexuality and the United Methodist Church* sometime after Vacation Bible School. One member has expressed interest, and if there is any other interest in the study, please let me know. If anyone wants further information on or has questions about the church and human sexuality, please let me know that, too.

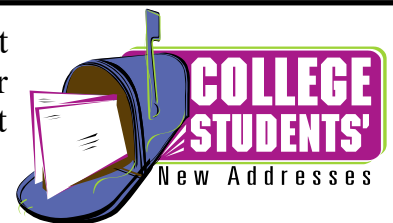

Even though it is summertime, the High Street Mission Team is still busy. Thanks to monetary donations from the Dave Trader Sunday School class, the United Methodist Men, and other individual donors, we were able to assemble and pack **126 hygiene kits for UMCOR** in May. These were delivered by Pastor Ned to our UMC District office near Petersburg where they were picked up by an 18 wheeler truck and taken to a warehouse in Pennsylvania where they will be distributed to areas of need.



The Mission Team sent a \$300 donation to the upcoming **RAM (Regional Area Medical) Clinic** in Emporia on August 20-21. This is a free clinic for those needing medical, vision, and dental care as well as hearing aids, dentures, mammograms, diabetic consultation, dermatology, immunizations, and much more. For more information go to www.ramusa.org. They are also looking for volunteers.

Our Penny Project is continuing throughout the summer for the **Heifer Project**. Please continue to bring your pennies and other donations to the church office or put them in the little brass bucket on the round table in the narthex. There is information there about the Heifer project. So far this year we have collected over \$1300!! Thanks for all of your support!



Big news with the **Franklin Cooperative Ministries!** The **Clothing Closet** that has been downtown for many years is being moved into the FCM building, so that everything can be under one roof. They are working on a renovation in the building right now, but they will be collecting clothes there in the near future. The downtown building will hopefully be sold.

Our **June Mission of the Month** project was making and **taking meals to about 30 of our church members and friends** who are unable to get out very often or who have certain needs where a meal would be much appreciated. Thanks to the Mission Team members who helped with this.

Our **July Mission of the Month** project will also be the Mission focus for our HSUMC Vacation Bible School this year. It is a program that is **helping young cancer patients flee the Ukraine and be placed into hospitals in safe countries.**

improving survival rates of children with cancer and other catastrophic diseases worldwide, has coordinated partner hospitals and foundations in its Global Alliance to move those young patients in peril in hospital basements in Ukraine to hospitals in Poland, Moldova, Germany, Italy, Spain, the United Kingdom, the Netherlands, Canada, and even some to the USA. The massive, coordinated effort provides urgent help

to Ukrainian families suffering through two profound events simultaneously: a cancer diagnosis of a child and an unprovoked war. To date, the organizations have helped more than 500 patients by translating medical records as well as providing transport convoys for many through the Polish border to the Unicorn Marian Wilemski Clinic in Bocheniec before they're transported to their final care destination at some of the best cancer centers in Europe, Canada, and the United States."

St. Jude Children's Research Hospital in Nashville, Tennessee, is coordinating global partners to evacuate children with cancer from Ukraine. Our donations will go through St. Jude. There will be more information available as VBS nears. If you wish to make a donation for this, you may make a check out to HSUMC and mark it for VBS Mission project.

Since this is a July/August newsletter, I will mention that the **August Mission of the Month** project will most likely be something related to **school supplies** for area children. Please watch our Facebook page and bulletins as the summer progresses.

F3 Nation

In less than 15 months, High Street has seen two of its members—Alan Duke & Mike Wrenn – inducted into the F3 Hampton Roads Hall of Fame. F3 – **Fitness, Fellowship, and Faith** – workouts Saturdays at High Street started on February 27, 2021. Eight months later, on September 18, 2021, Alan Duke, who also participates in F3 Tuesday mornings in Suffolk, logged his 50th F3 workout. That put him into the Hall of Fame, and his F3 name – Divot – was added to a caber dubbed Lady Glitter Sparkles. Eight months later, on May 21, 2022, Mike Wrenn logged his 50th F3 workout, and his F3 name – Super Trooper – was added as well.



Each F3 chapter has its own name, and High Street's is Log Deck. "Franklin & Southampton have always been known as a logging community," Alan says, "and on a logging site, the log deck is the epicenter of the operation where logs are sorted and loaded on trucks. Our log deck is where we come together for F3."

The Log Deck had 14 participants for its first anniversary workout last February, and, on Saturdays when the United Methodist Men have breakfast, F3 has had participants stay and eat on at least two occasions. In May, Paul Okoniewski, area director of Young Life Suffolk, led the F3 workout here and then spoke about his ministry at the UMM breakfast. Alan Duke knows Paul Okoniewski from 5:30 a.m. F3 workouts Tuesdays in Suffolk.

All men are invited to Log Deck workouts Saturdays at 8 a.m. Even if you can't come for the workout, please come to the devotion that starts at 9 a.m.


