Mission Team News

Our "Penny Project" for 2024 has been announced. We will be donating our "pennies and other coins" to the non-profit organization, Grazin' AcresTherapeutic

Riding Center right in our own area, Isle of Wight County. We will be giving you more information about this project as time goes on, but here is a brief overview: Grazin Acres is located on the Ivor Road. You may have passed it on the way to Ivor. They serve physically, mentally, emotionally and learning disabled students in the city of Franklin and Southampton, Isle of Wight and Sussex counties. Therapeutic riding and equine assisted activities help these students build confidence, improve muscle strength, flexibility, concentration, memory, socialization skills and much more. They provide services for over 100 participants yearly with 8 horses. Grazin' Acres offers morning school programs with the Special Education programs in Franklin and Southampton County Schools as well as evening programs. They also work with at-risk youth. Our donations to this worthwhile program will help with operational and equipment costs like feed, hay, farrier and veterinary care for the horses, educational training for the volunteers, facilities maintenance and upgrades. Administrative costs are less than 10% of the total budget. If you would like to learn more about Grazin' Acres, you can go to their website www.grazn'acres.org.

By the way the grand total for our "Penny Project" of 2023 was \$2872.50 for The Society of St. Andrew! Thanks for all of your support! You may drop off your pennies, coins, bills in one of the brass buckets in the narthex or on the window ledge outside of the church office or bring them by the office during normal office hours.

Many thanks to the 14 or so volunteers who helped with the Pizza Lunch for our area First Responders on Monday, February 12, in our fellowship hall. We think we had 50+ guests for lunch from Fire, Rescue, Police and Sheriff Departments all over our area! There were many positive and grateful comments throughout the lunch. This was part of the Mission Team's "From the Heart of High Street" project for the month of February. At the time of writing this email, we have also heard of many individual acts of kindness from our High Street family towards church members and throughout our community. Thanks to all who participated in this sharing of love and kindness.
