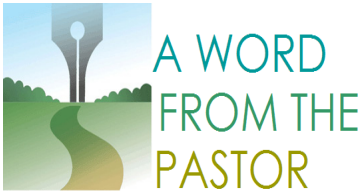

Thank you to **Margaret Mackan**, **Jim Yarborough**, and **Ricky Darden** for providing the greenery and setting up the cross, and to the congregation members for the live flowers that adorn it. Thanks also to those who purchased the beautiful Easter Lilies in the sanctuary, and to **Pat & Sybil Newman** for arranging them.



There's a date I'd like for you to put on the calendar, and that date is Saturday, June 24. I'm inviting you to join me in helping with the Foodbank at 618 South Street that afternoon, 12-2:30 p.m. It won't take much of your Saturday, and it will leave you free for things such as F3 that morning. The idea for this came when I volunteered for the same shift a few months ago and found that the youth group from Newsoms Baptist Church had volunteered that morning. Whatever your age, please think about volunteering on that date, and please let me know if you have any questions about how to volunteer.

On the subject of the Foodbank, here are the other volunteer dates I have scheduled for May and June:

- Tuesday, May 16, 12-3 p.m., at Southampton Meadows
- Tuesday, May 23, 12-3:30 p.m. at 618 South Street
- Tuesday, June 20, 12-3 p.m., at Southampton Meadows

Foodbank ministry has been important to me since my time on the Eastern Shore. My friend **Nancy Parks**, who just turned 83, is among the members of Cheriton UMC who volunteered for the Foodbank then and who still volunteers. In Norfolk, I used to help with food distribution at St. Mary's Basilica, which has provided tens of millions of meals in the last 60 years. My mother was still alive when I was volunteering at St. Mary's, and I was always aware of seeing people her age in that setting and wondering how little would have to change for my mother or me to find ourselves in such circumstances.

I am grateful for High Street's backpack ministry, and for **Hope Hickam**, who volunteers at the Foodbank, and for others, including the late **Rita Lewis**, who also showed interest in volunteering there. As I said in a recent sermon, I hope to learn the names and faces of folks I see at the Foodbank here, as I did on the Eastern Shore. As I said at the end of the 11 a.m. service April 16, after we'd prayed about shootings in Harrisonburg, Louisville, and Dadeville, Ala., I hope that High Street's being in the community – whether with the Foodbank, Franklin Cooperative Ministries, the Ministerial Alliance of the Franklin Police, or another avenue – allows us to show our neighbors that we are interested in them and care about them and are here for them. May we give life in this way.

On Friday, March 31, the United Methodist Women—and Men—volunteered at the Franklin Cooperative Ministries clothing closet switching out the winter clothes for summer.



Our Mission of the Month for April is to put together the hygiene kits for 210 4th and 5th grade students from S.P. Morton Elementary School in Franklin. **Cassandra Howery**, the guidance counselor, had asked for some support for this project. She has noticed that there is a need for items such as soap, deodorant, toothpaste and toothbrushes for these children as they reach a certain age, and not all students are able to have access to certain items. The Mission Team has used some of the money donated by our generous congregation for local mission projects to purchase these items in bulk. We will be meeting after the 11:00 worship service on Sunday, April 30th in the fellowship hall to put together these kits. It shouldn't take too long, but "many hands make light work"! Anyone is welcome to come! Stay tuned for more info, as there just might be some pizza offered as well.



Our May Mission of the Month will be to gather items for the "UMCOR Cleaning Buckets" that are distributed by the United Methodist Committee on Relief all over our country and even beyond during times of disasters, such as floods, hurricanes, and tornados. We have seen and heard of many of these such events in the past 6 months, so that is why we are choosing to do this collection. Beginning on Sunday, April 30, there will be index cards on the round table in the narthex. On each of these cards there will be an item listed that will be included in the bucket. All you need to do is pick up one or several of the cards, go out and buy the item(s), and then return them to church no later than Sunday, May 28th. There will be boxes marked "Cleaning Buckets" in the narthex and in the hallway near the church office. We have to get these buckets to the District Office near Petersburg the first week of June, so please adhere to the deadline. Also, some of the items on the list are very specific in terms of size or type, so that everything can fit in the bucket, so please try to be as accurate as possible. Thanks so much for your help with this project. These buckets will be taken to the Virginia United Methodist Church annual Conference in June along with many other kits and buckets from all over our conference and then on to a warehouse to be distributed as needed.

Our Backpack Program is winding down for the school year. We have one more "packing session" on Tuesday, May 9th at 5:00 p.m. in the fellowship hall. Thanks to all of you who have supported this program for food insecure children at S.P. Morton Elementary School, whether it has been financially or by helping pack or deliver the food to the school. After the May packing and deliveries, we will take a break for the summer and resume the program in the fall.



Our "Mission Garden" is making a come-back!! We are hoping that there will be some tilling and planting in the next 6 weeks or so. We are in the process of talking with the Food Bank here in Franklin, and trying to gather some volunteers to help. There is also opportunity to plant and care for your own small plot and give back 10% of what you grow if you'd like. February was Heart Havens Month in the Virginia Conference of the UMC. In case you don't know, Heart Havens is a non-profit organization that provides a home and 24 hour support to adults with a developmental disability. There are homes across Virginia serving approximately 25 clients. They have purchased another home in the Richmond area and are in the process of remodeling it and adding another bedroom and bathroom. We are making a donation of \$200 to help with the completion of this home. High Street UMC has supported Heart Havens for many years.

Present plans include:

- 1 - obtaining soil samples

- 5 - create a sign for the garden and benches for workers and other folks to come and sit and enjoy nature

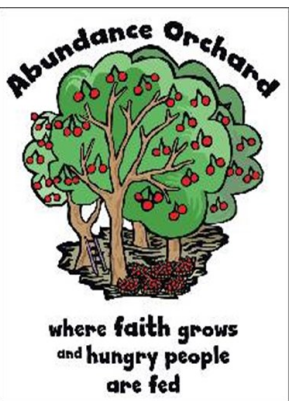


CHAIR YOGA AND MORE...
