United Women of Faith Sunday







Sunday, October 16, was Laity Sunday for the Methodist Church. In honor of that day, the United Women in Faith chose this date for United Methodist Women's Sunday for both the 8:30 a.m. Contemporary service, and 11 a.m. Traditional service. The Choir sang a lovely three-part anthem, "The Potters Hand". Lisa Strozier and Gaynelle Riddick shared their Faith through the message. Thank you to all the ladies who participated in speaking, greeting, etc. If you missed this inspirational service, you can still view it on Facebook (service October 16).

















At Charge Conference Oct. 11 in Emporia, **Tim Beck**, District Director of Vision and Vitality, gave us five takeaways. Try as I might, I couldn't write quickly enough to capture them verbatim, so I asked Tim to send me his points, and he replied with the following:

Five Reasons Why Vision & Vitality are Essential

- 1. "The reason people go to church today is that they've been moved from being a consumer to being a contributor. They don't just go to be served, they go to serve." To this end, Tim asked, "Do you have ways for people to serve in their walk with Christ? Does it give them purpose? Fulfillment? Feeling of usefulness?"
- 2. "People don't just attend church. People want to be the church. What does it mean to be the church today, post-COVID?"
- 3. "Spiritual maturity isn't about how much you know. It's about how much you love. How well does your church truly love? Not each other...those 'not yet gathered.' If yes, what proof do you have?" I think it was at this point that Tim asked us how much our churches love those people right outside our front door.
- 4. "You can't build the future of the church on passionless, disengaged people. Are you passionate about Jesus? Is spreading that passion a priority in your life? Proof? What do teenagers think of your church? If you can engage them, you can engage anyone."
- 5. "Too many leaders try to please people who complain too much and contribute too little. Where does your pastor spend the majority of his/her time? The answer to that question is the key to your church's effectiveness in ministry."

Fortunately, Tim didn't give us a time limit to answer these, and while I'm tempted to offer some answers, I'm more inclined to ask for your feedback. Please let me know where you see room for improvement. I'm further tempted to ask you to cite failures, since my friend Michael says that success teaches us nothing, but failure may be too harsh a word. Instead, let me know where you see room for improvement, and if you want to throw in some success stories from the past, that's okay, too. I find myself lacking in institutional knowledge and I look forward to hearing what you have to share.

On the subject of the Foodbank, let me share my November volunteer dates with you: I'm slated to help Wednesday, Nov. 9, noon-3 p.m. at Hayden Village, and Saturday, Nov. 12, 12:30-3 p.m. at the Martin Luther King Center. Please join me if you feel so inclined.

Thanks for your participation in this project. It will provide a meal for those in our community who might not be able to afford a nice meal for this holiday.

Mission of the Month Projects

Our October Mission of the Month project was collecting items for the "cleaning buckets" that will be sent to UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) which helps people all over the world in times of disasters and emergency. The deadline for these items is October 30th. Thanks so much for your generous support of this project. We will give you an update in the December newsletter.

Our November Mission of the Month project will be the collection of boxed mac 'n cheese and monetary donations for the Food Lion gift cards (see article above).

Our December mission projects will begin on the first Sunday in Advent, November 27th with our three "Advent Trees" - the "Tree of Warmth" (items of warmth such as gloves, hats, scarves, coats, pjs, etc. for children and adults in need in our community. The next tree is the "Angel Tree" where you can select an angel off the tree and bring in a gift for a child. Lastly we have the "Tree of Stars" which is a tree that supports our missionary, Jacques Akasa Umembudi, and his Wings of Caring Aviation Ministry in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and other mission projects. You may honor or remember a loved one or a friend with a \$7.00 donation. For each one a star will be placed on our tree in the narthex.

The Mission Team has a few other ways you can be involved. The team of volunteers is getting ready to start on another house. They are in the process of finding a house in need of repair that they can handle. This year marks sixteen years since Carter left us-we still struggle to believe it! He was 14 and brought so much joy to us and those that knew him. We continue to try very hard to live life with the joy he brought to it, and do things that would make him smile! Our sweet Rebecca and Witt lovingly share our grandson Henry with us, and for that we are so very grateful! With Henry in our lives, I honestly feel Carter's presence and smile quite often!

This is almost a Part Two of the article from last year. This year Henry is more active, so we can do more things with him and watch his reactions. We have enjoyed having him at the river, playing in the water and sand, and riding in Kent's boat. The memories of Carter riding in the boat as a young boy washed over Kent and me. Henry taking our hands for a walk or holding his hands up to be held, warm our hearts beyond measure as me remember Carter doing the same. Carter loved to go to Walmart or Dollar Tree, especially if it meant maybe getting a little treat. Post pandemic, I have been venturing out with Henry a little. On my first trips by myself with him to Walmart and Dollar Tree, I teared up. Watching his expressions of wonderment as we walked up the aisles reminded me of another young boy that loved to go look around. Watching Henry during the Children's messages at Church reminds me of another young boy who couldn't sit still. Henry is his own person and we know that, but it is heartwarming and healing to remember precious moments of another little boy.

There's also a young man in church who reminds me of Carter-Zack Duke. I watch him acolyte and it brings back such fun memories of watching Carter do the same. Zack is such a kind young man and I really enjoy getting to know him. These Godwink moments are the best!

Moments and memories can wash over me and Kent like waves. They can make me cry, and at the same time fill my heart with joy! Grief still stays close by, and I believe it always will, but I do believe that God knows when to put joy in our lives and there is room in our hearts for both!

It still comforts me and fills my heart knowing that we have special angels that do indeed watch over us! God continues to show us grace when we need it, sometimes in the most unexpected, wonderful ways. We remain grateful for the love and support we continue to feel from our community and our loving church family.
