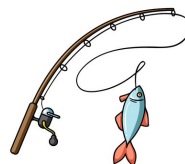

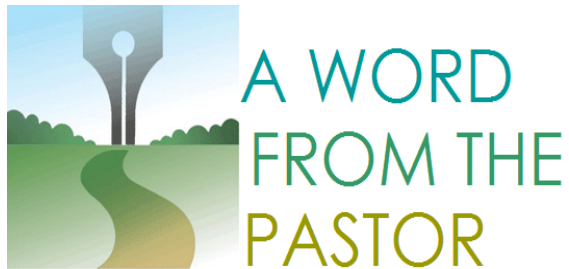

Ten days ago, **Kathy Worrell** sent me a list of small groups for which sign-up sheets may be offered at our Bronco Club worship Sept. 11. I was surprised by several things I saw on the list, among them a handbell choir, although I shouldn't have been surprised by that, since I know that there's a handbell closet at the back of the sanctuary. Some of the ministries on the list – including a sports team, prison ministry, and financial planning -- were marked with stars to show that they'd been discussed pre-COVID. Other items

rang some bells for me, such as Community Day and the Open Heart Mission Garden.

Community Day, from what I've seen and read, was offered in 2018 and was scheduled to be offered again in April 2020 but was cancelled by COVID. I wasn't sure what Community Day was all about. I saw a flyer that mentioned popcorn, hot dogs, pony rides, and a bounce house, and when **Richard Walker** told me that Community Day was, in part, a health fair, I remembered hearing that a blood drive was associated with it. I also saw that Community Day was a huge event, with 100 volunteers signed up for 2018 and 139 signed up for 2020. Finally, I saw that a worship service was planned for the Friday before Community Day in 2020 and was told that other churches were planning to participate that year as well.

I don't know if it's time for another Community Day or not – I was told that it was offered every other year because it took two years to organize – but I'm looking forward to seeing what kind of response we get to the sign-up sheets when we meet for worship at the Bronco Club. I think that knowing the interest and the support that we have will help us plan for ministry. I've heard in relaunch seminars for the last year or more that the pre-COVID church is gone and that it's not coming back, so maybe the best plan to take is to see where we have the discipleship to plan specific ministries. Please pray to discern where God is leading you in ministries we can offer at High Street.

Normally I schedule two afternoons a month to help the Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia and the Eastern Shore, but there's so much going on in September that I have three dates on the calendar. The first is Sept. 14, where, for the first time, I'll be helping with box distribution at Hayden Village. I've helped with the Healthy Food pantry a couple of times at Hayden Vil-

lage, but not with box distribution to seniors, and I'm looking forward to that. The hours are noon-3 p.m. Please consider helping in this and other Foodbank events.

The next date is the biggest, because the grand opening for the Foodbank's new facility on South Street is Thursday, Sept. 15, at 10 a.m. Thursday mornings are busy for me, with the men's breakfast at Fred's at 7, followed by coffee with other pastors at 8 and the God Talk Bible study at the Daily Dose at 10:30, but I'll make time to be at the ribbon cutting, even if it means delaying the start of Bible study. The new facility will not only help the Foodbank meet the needs of those experiencing food insecurity, but will also have space for programs that address the causes of food insecurity. I'm very excited about this ministry and look forward to seeing how it unfolds.

The last date on the list for September is Tuesday the 27th, when I'm helping at mobile distribution at Southampton Meadows, 12:30-3 p.m. This will be my fourth time there, and we always have fun filling people's trunks with meat, produce, dairy, and bread.

I'm grateful that I was introduced to community involvement through the Foodbank by members of Cheriton UMC during my time on the Eastern Shore. Again, please consider helping with Foodbank events as a way of community involvement.

SAFER Ukraine

Supporting Action For Emergency Responses in Ukraine

Vacation Bible School Mission Project St. Jude Global SAFER Ukraine

This year in VBS our mission project focused on the war in Ukraine and how the children with cancer are being affected. The children at **HSUMC Bible School** learned how these children who were living in war torn Ukraine and also in treatment from sort of childhood cancer were being helped by the **SAFER Ukraine** organization. SAFER stands for Supporting Action for Emergency Response. **St. Jude Global** is a key organization in this evaluation and placement of these child cancer patients.

"SAFER Ukraine is led by St. Jude Global alongside numerous partners including doctors and nurses, researchers, hospitals, foundations, non-government organizations and governments. SAFER Ukraine created a registry to keep track of children whose medical records have been translated, and who have been evacuated or whose cases are being monitored. This registry currently includes more than 1,100 Ukrainian patients." Through SAFER Ukraine, children with cancer have been evacuated from Ukraine and are continuing their cancer care elsewhere.

Throughout the week of VBS we prayed for these children and asked God to be with them and bless them as they left their homeland and traveled to foreign places to continue their care to cure their cancer. We collected an offering each night and surpassed 2 goals! With our nightly offerings plus donations from other church members we ended up with \$2,212.43!!

This money will go to St. Jude Global to help with the expenses of this global project. Some of these children, though, have ended up being placed at St. Jude in Memphis, Tennessee.

Thank you all for your generous support of this project!!! Please keep praying for these precious children!!!

Please take time to stop by and create a card!!

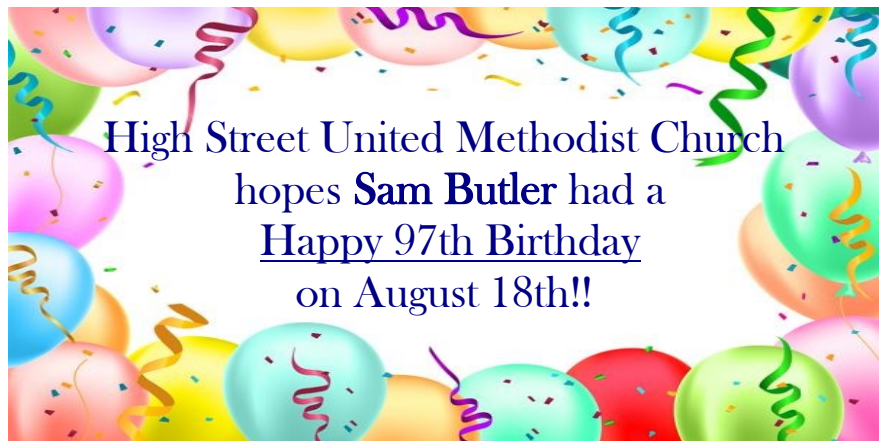

Mission of the Month Project for September:

Our **September Mission of the Month Project** is collecting yarn. The Deerfield Women's correctional Center in Capron is in need of skeins or partial skeins of yarn for the inmates. There is a large group of inmates who crochet and knit hats, scarves, blankets and the like, then they are delivered to Southampton County Social Services to give to people at Christmas and during the cold winter months. This is a great project because it helps 2 groups of people - the inmates and the people receiving the warm items.



Penny Project for Heifer International



Since last fall, our pennies have been collected for **Heifer International**. This project gifts animals to extremely poor families across the globe - heifers to provide milk and an income, sheep to provide wool and an income, a flock of chicks to provide eggs, meat, and an income. There are many other animals to choose from.

There is also a promise made from each family that they will share one of the first offspring with a neighbor in need.

The Mission team will be deciding at our September meeting on a new "penny project" for the upcoming year. So get your pennies, other change and donations in by September 15th. Our total as of now is a little over \$1,300!! Think of all the animals we can gift with that amount!! The children and adults at the Ice Cream Social voted on their top 3 favorite animals. Backpack Program for S.P. Morton Elementary School Food Insecure Children

Our backpack feeding program for food insecure children who attend **S.P. Morton Elementary School** in Franklin will be starting up again soon, probably by the end of September or early October. This is our 10th or 11th year of participating in this program through the Food Bank of Southeastern Virginia. I've lost track!



Right now we are starting our fundraising to sponsor our 50 children. The actual cost per student is \$110 for the school year. You may sponsor one child for this amount or make a donation of any amount. Our total commitment for this program for the 2022-2023 school year is \$5,400. At the church picnic there will be a sign up sheet for anyone interested in helping pack the bags of food monthly. This sign up sheet will also be with the others in the church narthex for a few Sundays following the picnic. It usually takes a little less than an hour to pack the bags. Most of the time we meet on a Tuesday at 5:00 p.m. Watch the bulletins and Facebook for announcements of dates and times. You can also sign up or call the church office to be put on the email list of Backpack volunteers.
