1 John 1:1-10

1 John 1:1-10 ¹ We proclaim to you the one who existed from the beginning,^[a] whom we have heard and seen. We saw him with our own eyes and touched him with our own hands. He is the Word of life. ² This one who is life itself was revealed to us, and we have seen him. And now

we testify and proclaim to you that he is the one who is eternal life. He was with the Father, and then he was revealed to us. ³ We proclaim to you what we ourselves have actually seen and heard so that you may have fellowship with us. And our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ. ⁴ We are writing these things so that you may fully share our joy.^[b] ⁵ This is the message we heard from Jesus^[c] and now declare to you: God is light, and there is no darkness in him at all. ⁶ So we are lying if we say we have fellowship with God but go on living in spiritual darkness; we are not practicing the truth. ⁷ But if we are living in the light, as God is in the light, then we have fellowship with each other; and the blood of Jesus, his Son, cleanses us from all sin. ⁸ If we claim we have no sin, we are only fooling ourselves and not living in the truth. ⁹ But if we confess our sins to him, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all wickedness. ¹⁰ If we claim we have not sinned, we are calling God a liar and showing that his word has no place in our hearts.

Welcome to the month of April of 2024. We are now moving forth from the celebration of Easter. We are a peo-

ple of resurrection. What does this mean? I mean that as Christians we celebrate our faith in Jesus Christ as He defeated the Cross and Death. Jesus is our only Hope in the world of today. 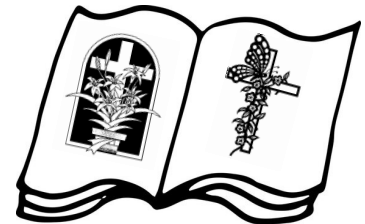

Mission Team News

Thanks to all who supported our Baked Potato/Salad Bar Luncheon on Sunday, March 17th, St. Patrick's Day (*see photos below*). We served approximately

80 people. The fellowship and food were enjoyed by all! We collected \$513.00 in donations to support the Backpack Program for 50 food insecure children at S.P. Morton Elementary School in Franklin. Even though we are not packing the boxes of food that go in these backpacks anymore, due to the changes in the program implemented by the Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia, these 50 children are still able to receive this much needed food twice a month. Thanks to all for these generous donations! Thanks also to our great Mission Team!!

Our ongoing "Penny Project" has a new focus for 2024! We will be collecting pennies and other coins (and even dollars if you wish) to support a great local non-profit organization called "Grazin' Acres Therapeutic Riding Center" in Ivor, Virginia. This non-profit serves physically, mentally, emotionally and learning disabled students in the city of Franklin as well as Southampton, Isle of Wight, and Sussex Counties. Therapeutic riding and equine assisted activities help these students build confidence, improve muscle strength, flexibility, concentration, memory, socialization skills and much more. They provide services for over 100 participants yearly with 8 horses. Grazin' Acres also offers morning school programs with Franklin and Southampton Schools as well as evening programs. In addition they work with "at-risk" youth. Our donations to this worthwhile program will help with operational equipment costs like feed, hay, farrier and veterinary care for the horses, educational training for the volunteers, facilities maintenance and upgrades.

Administrative costs are less than 10% of the total budget. If you would like to learn more about "Grazin' Acres" you can go to their website www.grazinacres.org. You may drop off your donations in the brass buckets in the narthex area or at the church office. We hopefully will have a program about "Grazin' Acres" soon.

The Mission Team also made a \$200 donation to Heart Havens in honor of "Heart Havens Month" in February. In case you don't know, Heart Havens supports adults with intellectual disabilities across the state of Virginia. It began with the Virginia United Methodist Conference and is a non-profit organization that provides residential support to adults with a developmental disability. "It's so much more than just a roof and a bed. At Heart Havens, we empower people to discover what they love and pursue their hopes and passions. Whether that's getting involved in community theater, giving back to the community through a pet food drive, or simply having a party with friends, we support people with a developmental disability as they make their goals and dreams happen. Heart Havens operates homes in Richmond, Stuarts Draft, Lynchburg, and Virginia Beach. All of the homes have the capacity to house four residents, who are fully supervised at all times with dedicated and experienced staff."

The Mission Garden Team is beginning their preparations for our garden for this spring/summer. There are plans to do even more this year, so if you're interested in helping or just having your own little space, please contact **Jeff Brown** or **Mike Ponder** soon.
