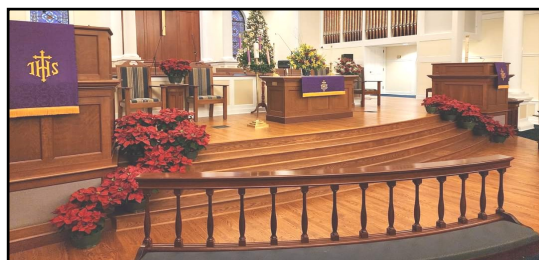

## Romans 12 Respect For Authority

<sup>1</sup> Everyone must submit to governing authorities. For all authority comes from God, and those in positions of authority have been placed there by God. <sup>2</sup> So anyone who rebels against authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and they will be punished. <sup>3</sup> For the authorities do not strike fear in people who are doing right, but in those who are doing wrong. Would you like to live without fear of the authorities? Do what is right, and they will honor you.

<sup>4</sup> The authorities are God's servants, sent for your good. But if you are doing wrong, of course you should be afraid, for they have the power to punish you. They are God's servants, sent for the very purpose of punishing those who do what is wrong. <sup>5</sup> So you must submit to them, not only to avoid punishment, but also to keep a clear conscience. <sup>6</sup> Pay your taxes, too, for these same reasons. For government workers need to be paid. They are serving God in what they do. <sup>7</sup> Give to everyone what you owe them: Pay your taxes and government fees to those who collect them, and give respect and honor to those who are in authority. <sup>8</sup> Owe nothing to anyone—except for your obligation to love one another. If you love your neighbor, you will fulfill the requirements of God's law. <sup>9</sup> For the commandments say, "You must not commit adultery. You must not murder. You must not steal. You must not covet."<sup>[a]</sup> These—and other such commandments—are summed up in this one commandment: "Love your neighbor as yourself."<sup>[b]</sup> <sup>10</sup> Love does no wrong to others, so love fulfills the requirements of God's law. <sup>11</sup> This is all the more urgent, for you know how late it is; time is running out. Wake up, for our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed. <sup>12</sup> The night is

almost gone; the day of salvation will soon be here. So remove your dark deeds like dirty clothes, and put on the shining armor of right living. <sup>13</sup> Because we belong to the day, we must live decent lives for all to see. Don't participate in the darkness of wild parties and drunkenness, or in sexual promiscuity and immoral living, or in quarreling and jealousy. <sup>14</sup> Instead, clothe yourself with the presence of the Lord Jesus Christ. And don't let yourself think about ways to indulge your evil desires.

Well here we are about to enter into the month of February of 2024. What do you think of when February is mentioned? Maybe, LOVE? Yes, love is thought of and promoted and advertised widely for Valentine's Day. This year take that time to share your thoughts and expressions with that special person in your life. Now, what does God have to say about that word: LOVE? In Romans chapter 13, God is quite clear about Love and how God commands Love to be enacted through your Life and Faith. First, God shares about authority and those of authority and how we should not only respect them, but to listen to them. Next he shares about what Love is and how the act of Love does fulfill the requirements of God's law. Lastly, God shares how we are to live and not to live. He expresses most importance should be placed upon how we are to be seen and presented to the world. We are to be clothed in the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ. Please take the time this month to read God's Word and see how His Word can bless you, transform you, and guide you.



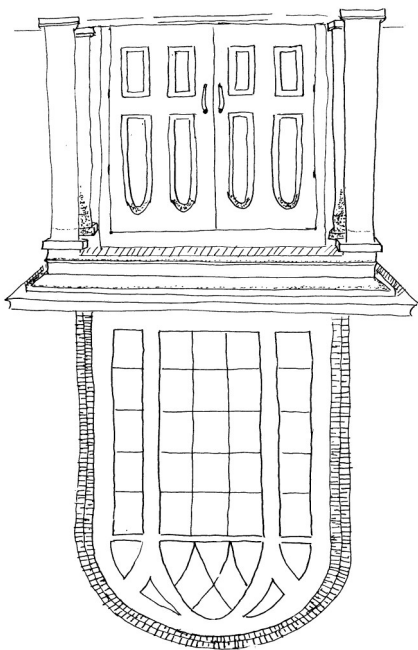
