So What Is This Disaffiliation All About?

Most recently the question has arisen from several members of our congregation, "So why isn't High Street UMC voting on whether or not to leave the United Methodist Church?"

At the Administrative Council meeting on May 15th, the Council reviewed our history on this matter and wanted to let you know where the Council stands on disaffiliation. Four years ago our pastor at that time, Nathan Decker, embarked on a series of small group discussions centered around the United Methodist Church and human sexuality. Specifically, we discussed our beliefs in understanding God's relationship with gay Christians. The results of these discussions were discussed lovingly. We realized some of our High Street family struggled with same sex marriage, but most did not.

We appreciated that we have different opinions about sexuality just as we have different opinions about abortion, capital punishment, gun control, and politics. We did not believe that those differing opinions were problematic, but members believed it was more problematic to be in a church where everyone believed the same thing.

In the last three years the Global Methodist Church (GMC) and the Wesleyan Covenant Association (WCA) have become very aggressive in trying to divide the United Methodist Church primarily over these sexuality issues. The UMC has appropriately created an avenue for churches to leave on this single area of disagreement only and has allowed them to take



their church facility with them. Each church that chooses to leave must be approved by the Annual Conference. Some areas, especially Georgia, South Carolina, North Carolina, Alabama, and Texas have seen more churches leave than other areas, but at this point only about 5% of church membership has chosen to leave.

The Global Methodist Church is a very conservative church and defines marriage as only between a man and a woman and in the confines of marriage. The GMC reserves the right to remove churches and/or pastors from their group if they choose.

The Church Council wants to assure you of several things. First, there will be no membership vote on whether High Street UMC will be leaving the United Methodist Church. Voting is hurtful and divisive.

Secondly, we affirm our belief that God has created all of us and loves the entirety of his creation, and lastly that we are choosing the path of discernment. We will monitor the changing politics in the UMC, but we ARE remaining a United Methodist congregation in Franklin/Southampton County, Virginia. I'm happy to turn the balance of space for my column over to Mike Ponder this month (see page 1, 'So What Is This..."). Mike addresses disaffiliation for us, as he did at the May 15 church council meeting, where he spoke eloquently.

I guess I'm not a fan of goodbyes, which is why I'm glad that my last Sunday here is on Father's Day, so everyone will have a different focus. I will reiterate my invitation to work with me at the Foodbank Saturday, June 24, noon-2:30

p.m. at 618 High Street. I also plan to volunteer with the Foodbank Tuesday, June 20, noon-3 p.m. at Southampton Meadows. It's always a joy to volunteer there and I'm glad that I'll have one last chance to do so.

Speaking of the Foodbank, food insecurity across the commonwealth of Virginia is one the ministries being supported by our Annual Conference offering. Other concerns include refugee resettlement and Partnerships of Hope, which ministers to Native Americans and in Cambodia, Vietnam, Mozambique, and Brazil. In particular, Brazil Shade and Fresh Water provide care, protection, and life skills for at-risk street children in Brazil. I remember the collection of the Annual Conference offering in 2009, when we were told of the frequency of the disappearance of street children in Brazil. In 2007, Religion & Ethics Newsweekly reported that 7 million children live on the streets of Brazil, where they're exposed to pedophiles, corruption, and murder. I'm glad that our conference is aware of this and is responding.

Our Mission of the Month project for May was collecting items for the UMCOR flood buckets that will go to Annual Conference in June. Thanks to everyone who contributed items or donations to go towards this project. We will give you an update in the next newsletter about how many buckets we were able to provide.

Thanks to those who stayed after church on April 30 to help package items for the 210 hygiene kits that were delivered to S.P. Morton Elementary School the following week.

They were very grateful for our donation of toothpaste, toothbrushes, deodorant, and soap.

Many of you have been placing your pennies and other coins in the brass buckets or little boxes in the narthex for our "penny project". You may remember that this money is going towards The Society of St. Andrew. We were able to send a check for \$200 to them for an initial donation. We will be sending more once in awhile and also be offering some hands-on projects perhaps this summer and fall. Also we are using their Bible School curriculum, "Abundance Orchard, Where Faith Grows, and Hungry People Are Fed" for our Vacation Bible School this summer, July 23-27. Don't forget to register your children so they can attend.

Thanks to all who have supported our Backpack Feeding Program for 75 food-insecure children at S.P. Morton Elementary School in Franklin this past year. We packed our last bags of food a couple of weeks ago .We will take a break this summer and start back up in the fall.

Our Lenten Butterfly Cross that was in the narthex during the Lenten season raised \$833 from donations to honor or remember loved ones and friends. Thanks to all who participated in this project. The money will go to fund local mission projects.

The Mission Garden out beside the Boy Scout building is starting back up. We will be planting some vegetables to donate to the Food Bank of Southeastern Virginia here in Franklin. There are also small plots available to our members for their own use. You can also agree to donate or tithe some of your produce from your garden to the Food Bank as well. Contact Mike Ponder or Jeff brown if you are willing to help out occasionally or of you'd like to have your own garden space. We will be collecting Hygiene Products ONLY for the Franklin Cooperative Ministries beginning this month (see article below). High Street No Longer Taking Food Donations for FCM

For many years, we as a church have been collecting food items monthly for the food pantry at the Franklin Cooperative Ministries. Since the Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia has opened a building on South Street in Franklin, the FCM has decided to close their food pantry and focus more on hygiene and household items since food stamps will not cover these. They also have increased the size of their clothing closet and moved it to their building on First Avenue. They also offer a diaper bank and continue to offer

other services such as help with power bills, dental needs, eye glasses, prescriptions, transportation, medical services, and temporary motel stays.

HSUMC will no longer take food donations, but will gladly collect any of the items listed below as well as monetary donations for the Franklin Cooperative ministries. As always you may bring any of these items to church and place them in the baskets or boxes marked for FCM. Thank you so much for your help for this valuable non-profit organization in our community.




