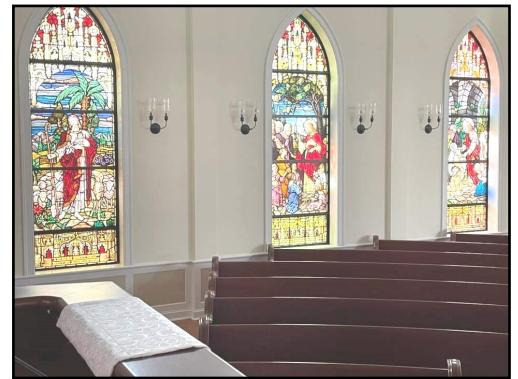

**Mission Team News**

The Virginia United Methodist Conference is sponsoring their "Kits for Conference" again this year. They are asking for 3 types of kits this year - cleaning kits, hygiene kits, and menstrual kits. The High Street Mission Team will be collecting items for the hygiene kits this time around. These will be **due Friday, May 31st**. There will be a box in the narthex and one in the hallway by the church office. You may provide all of the items for a kit or just drop off some of the items. Following is the list of items and instructions of how to put it together. Thanks for your support!

**Hygiene Kit**

- One hand towel (15"x25"-17"x27") (no kitchen towels)
- One comb (sturdy with at least 4-7 inches of teeth, no pocket combs or picks)
- Bath-size bar of soap (in package, 3 oz. or larger, no Ivory or Jergen's)
- 10 adhesive bandages (3/4 by 3 inches)
- Lay hand towel flat on a table. Lay the washcloth in the center of the towel.
- Fold the sides of the hand towel to cover the items. Grasp the tightly rolled bundle in the plastic bag, remove the air and seal.
- One washcloth
- One toenail or fingernail clipper
- One Adult size toothbrush (in package)
- One 1 gallon zip lock bag
- Place all remaining items on top of the wash cloth (except the plastic bag).

**March Madness Shampoo Challenge**

Our "Shampoo Challenge" was a great success, and we thank everyone for their great support! By the deadline we had collected 126 bottles of shampoo to donate to the Franklin Cooperative Ministry for their hygiene bags that they give out to people in our community who cannot afford these items on a regular basis. In case you're interested here are the totals for each team- Duke-42 UVA-39 NC State-27 VA Tech-12 UNC-6

The staff at FC Ministry was quite excited when we dropped off all of that shampoo!!

**Funds for Housing Projects in our Community**

Many of you have been very generous over the past few years in donating funds to aid with continuing our projects with helping some home owners in our community with house repairs. The home owners are usually older or physically unable to do it themselves. They also cannot afford to have the work done. In the past 5 years or so we have helped with 3 projects. We would love to keep doing this; however, our number of skilled people has diminished, and we are having trouble finding homes and appropriate people to work with. We have plenty of funds and hate that the money is just sitting there not being used. **Penny Project**

Please don't forget about our "Penny Project" for the "Grazin' Acres Therapeutic Riding Center" in our community. The Penny Pots in the narthex and near the church office have been quite empty lately. **All God's Children Camp**

The Virginia United Methodist Conference provides camps each summer for children ages 7-12 who have at least one parent who is incarcerated. These children are offered the chance for a "Christian week-long summer camp experience" for the cost of just \$10. In order for this to happen, donations are needed. Mentors are also needed to be with the children throughout the week. The Mission Team voted to make a donation of \$425.00 to cover the campership for one child for one week. ## May Mission of the Month

The Virginia United Methodist Conference is once again sponsoring their “Kits for Conference”, and High Street’s Mission Team will be collecting items for hygiene kits. Donations can be left in the narthex, or the church office, in marked boxes, and are due no later than May 31. You may provide entire kits, or just a few items—all donations are appreciated.

### List of Needed Items:

- One hand towel (15 x 25in. – 17 x 27in., no kitchen towels)
- One washcloth
- One comb (sturdy with 4-7in. of teeth, no pocket combs or picks)
- One toenail or fingernail clipper
- Bath-size soap (3oz. or larger bar, no Ivory or Jergen’s soap)
- One adult toothbrush (sealed in package)
- 10 adhesive bandages (¾ by 3in.)
- One 1-gallon zip lock bag

### Assembly Instructions:

1. Lay hand towel flat on table.
2. Lay the washcloth in the center of the towel.
3. Place all remaining items on top of the washcloth (except the plastic bag).
4. Fold the sides of the hand towel to cover the items.
5. Grasp the bundle tightly and roll over the remainder of the towel.
6. Place the tightly rolled bundle in the plastic bag, remove the air, and seal.

On Sunday, April 7, **Bill Billings** and **Kathy Worrell** were on hand to take directory photos and check accuracy of the information.
