

Parable of the Pharisee and Tax Collector

Luke 18:9-14

⁹ Then Jesus told this story to some who had great confidence in their own

righteousness and scorned everyone else: ¹⁰ "Two men went to the Temple to pray. One was a Pharisee, and the other was a despised tax collector. ¹¹ The Pharisee stood by himself and prayed this prayer: 'I thank you, God, that I am not like other people—cheaters, sinners, adulterers. I'm certainly not like that tax collector! ¹² I fast twice a week, and I give you a tenth of my income.' ¹³ "But the tax collector stood at a distance and dared not even lift his eyes to heaven as he prayed. Instead, he beat his chest in sorrow, saying, 'O God, be merciful to me, for I am a sinner.' ¹⁴ I tell you, this sinner, not the Pharisee, returned home justified before God. For those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."

We have heard the Parable on many occasions ... but today let us see what it says to us. Who are we and what do we represent to the world around us.

Perceptions create a BIG picture on how others

see us. In this parable we see one who claims to be righteous and is passing judgment on others while the other person just claims to be a sinner and seeks no judgment, but does seek the Mercy of God Almighty this message is quite clear that there are two entirely different individuals who are in prayer and Jesus is very clear that there is an end result of each of these actions. One who is seeking to exalt themselves will be humbled and the one who comes in total humility will be exalted by God. The message also is real clear that the sinner is justified meaning that this person who comes to God clearly as a sinner finds God's Peace and Comfort from God's Grace and Love. So today I ask you how do YOU come to God in Prayer and in Relationship with Jesus Christ. God bless you and anoint you with the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

The Angels would like to say thank you for the AC units that got put in the windows during the time of the new AC units being installed. Thank you for making sure our babies stayed cool. And always Thank you



UMCOR comes alongside those who suffer from natural or human-caused disaster - famine, hurricane, war, flood, fire, earthquake, or other events - to alleviate suffering and serve as a source of help and hope for the vulnerable." UMCOR is many times one of the first response teams to respond to a disaster and one of the last to leave. They also use local resources as much as possible. There have been many disasters and long-term suffering recently across our world - the war in Ukraine, the fires in Hawaii, the earthquake in Morocco, Hurricane Idalia in Florida, and the flooding in Libya. The Mission Team at High Street is using some of its funds to donate \$1,000 to UMCOR, specifying that \$200 go towards each area. Backpack Program

Usually this time of year we are gearing up for the Backpack Program sponsored by the Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia. We have been financially supporting 50 food-insecure children from S.P. Morton



Elementary School to receive bags of food to take home twice a month. We have also been packing and delivering the food to S.P. Morton for 10 months during the school year.

The Foodbank in Norfolk is trying to streamline their program, so we have been informed that we will no longer be involved in this process. The food will be packed in Norfolk and brought to the school from there. We are going to continue to financially support our 50 children from our local school at least for the 2023-24 school year. This is a \$5400 commitment. If you would like to sponsor a child for the school year the cost is \$110, or you can make a donation of any amount.

We are very sad to be losing the chance to be able to participate in this hands-on project to help children right here in Franklin, but please know that our monetary gifts will still be keeping the program alive for these children in our area. Thanks to the many volunteers who have given their time and gifts to the Backpack Program over the last 12 years!!


